Our end-of-year Recognition of Excellence Ceremony & Year 12 Graduation Ceremony, held on Monday 5th December, was a resounding success. This year we connected with all campuses across Australia. This was an exciting change and highlighted the work taking place to move to a regional school in all aspects of operations. It was great to acknowledge the outstanding achievements of our students and witness some entertaining musical items.



Cross-campus Visits (CCVs) were again a big factor in the success of our teaching team and the learning outcomes of our students. CCVs afford our staff and students the opportunity to collaborate with their teachers and peers from across the state, and interstate! Our students have also taken part in various educational incursions and excursions to further develop their understanding of their courses.

Professional learning plays a pivotal role in ensuring that our entire staff remains wellinformed and proficient in key areas. 
Both students and parents appreciate the efforts by staff to create the best possible outcomes for students, and they feel part of a safe, supportive and positive learning environment.

Western Australian Certificate of Education and ATAR

WACE Achievement

In 2024, all 18 graduating students in OSG WA were eligible for the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE), and 100% successfully achieved it. This outstanding result reflects the cohort's resilience despite various challenges and highlights the effectiveness of intervention programs. Of the 18 students achieving WACE, 10 students (56% - slightly less than 2023) were on an ATAR pathway, and 8 students (44%) were on a general pathway.

In comparison, the state average for WACE achievement in 2024 was 92.4% of eligible students, underscoring the effectiveness of OSG WA's pedagogy.


