Across New South Wales, OneSchool Global has continued to foster a strong culture of collaboration and cohesion in pursuit of educational excellence. With 12 schools spanning from Albury to Armidale and Illawarra to Condobolin, our focus remains on building a united school community that empowers students to achieve at the highest level.

In 2024, OneSchool Global NSW – Wagga Wagga experienced a year of consolidation and growth, with continued dedication to the Learning to Learn (L2L) framework. Staff and students actively embraced self-directed learning, supported by the tutorial booking system that connected learners with specialist teachers across the state. A key highlight was the completion of Stage 1 of the Campus Modernisation Program, which saw the transformation of the Primary Learning Centre (LC). This upgraded facility now features cutting-edge technology, a central Studio space, and purposefully designed zones that reflect and enhance the L2L framework, contributing to the vision of an all-through school.

Looking ahead, Stage 2 of the Campus Modernisation Program is scheduled for the summer holidays and will focus on refurbishing the Secondary Learning Centre, Food Technology room, Science laboratory, and adjacent classrooms. These enhancements are designed to meet global standards, ensuring students benefit from future-ready learning spaces that support innovation and academic excellence.

The student leadership team demonstrated strong commitment to respect and responsibility through a range of initiatives in 2024. One of their key initiatives was the introduction of a sticky note goal-setting system, designed to help students take ownership of their learning and track personal progress in a visible way. They also launched a persona award program to celebrate students who consistently modelled the schools core values, encouraging positive behaviour and a culture of recognition. Further, the Wellbeing Team took an active role in introducing and organising Friday morning fitness sessions, promoting physical wellbeing and teamwork. The SLT's leadership extended to the organisation of fundraisers and activity days such as Biggest Morning Tea, Athletics and Harmony Week, all of which contributed to a more inclusive and connected school environment. By actively listening to student voices, supporting younger peers, and implementing the above initiatives, the SLT helped foster a positive, respectful school culture where every student feels empowered to contribute and lead with integrity.

We look ahead to 2025 with great anticipation, building on the achievements of 2024 with a continued focus on strengthening school culture to ensure every student is empowered with the best opportunities to succeed. We extend our sincere appreciation to the School, State, and National Boards for their steadfast support and encouragement throughout the year.

OneSchool Global NSW – Wagga Wagga school is an independent, co-educational school which operates in the OneSchool Global network of schools. OneSchool Global NSW - Wagga Wagga is uniquely connected to eleven independent OneSchool Global schools across NSW.

OneSchool Global was established by members of the Plymouth Brethren Christian Church, for students and families of the Church Community. The School is strongly supported by volunteers from the Church Community. OneSchool Global recruits professional leaders, teaching and administrative staff from all walks of life and provides a positive and respectful working environment.

OneSchool Global NSW - Wagga Wagga has an enrolment of 38 students. The school has a rich academic program which is supported by an extensive ICT blended mode of teaching and learning. The school also offers a vibrant co-curricular program which includes sport, music, and community involvement.

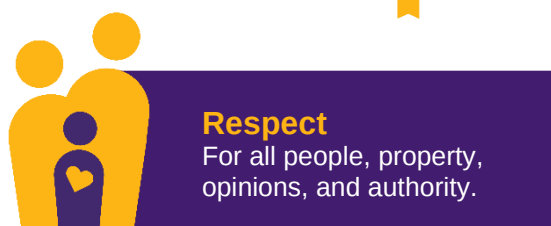
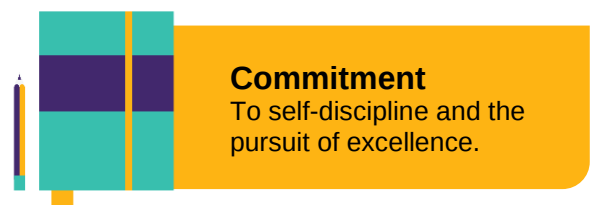
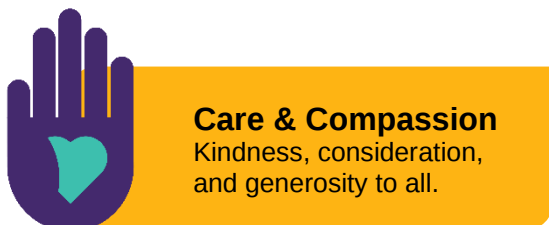
School Ethos

Outcomes and Results

Student Outcomes in Standardised National Literacy and Numeracy Testing

OneSchool Global NSW – Wagga Wagga completed NAPLAN in 2024; results for 2024 were published on the [My School website](#) in February 2025. NAPLAN comparison data is limited due to the number of enrolments examined.

Higher School Certificate (HSC)

In 2024, across NSW our students completed Compressed Curriculum with 118 Year 12 students finalising their HSC courses. Additionally, 94 Year 11 students completed their first three HSC courses, with a total of 211 students sitting HSC examinations in 20 subjects. For OneSchool Global NSW - Wagga Wagga in 2024 11 students sat HSC examinations across 12 subjects.

OneSchool Global NSW - Wagga Wagga is uniquely connected to eleven independent OneSchool Global schools across NSW. Secondary courses are delivered from one OneSchool Global NSW school to another due to external provider exemption. To comply with privacy and personal information policies, the below HSC results and commentary information has been prepared as a comparison across the 11 schools.

OneSchool Global NSW recorded 22 Band 6's across the eleven schools. The overall trend of students accessing higher bands continued in 2024, with 15 subjects achieving a significant number of Band 5's in the high mark range.

OneSchool Global NSW continued to experience strong performances in TAS subjects, with five students being nominated for SHAPE, the annual exhibition of exemplary Major Projects developed by HSC Design and Technology, Industrial Technology and Textiles and Design students.

For the fifth year running an OneSchool Global NSW student gained first place in NSW for Financial Services.

With our Academic Program, OneSchool Global NSW schools set a goal to achieve an average ATAR of 74. In 2024 we achieved an average ATAR of 63.72 and HSC mark of 73.34. The program supported students in improving study habits through teacher tutorials, accountability, and effective use of Learning Centre zones. Overall, helping our students aim for personal excellence and a collective improvement in the HSC.

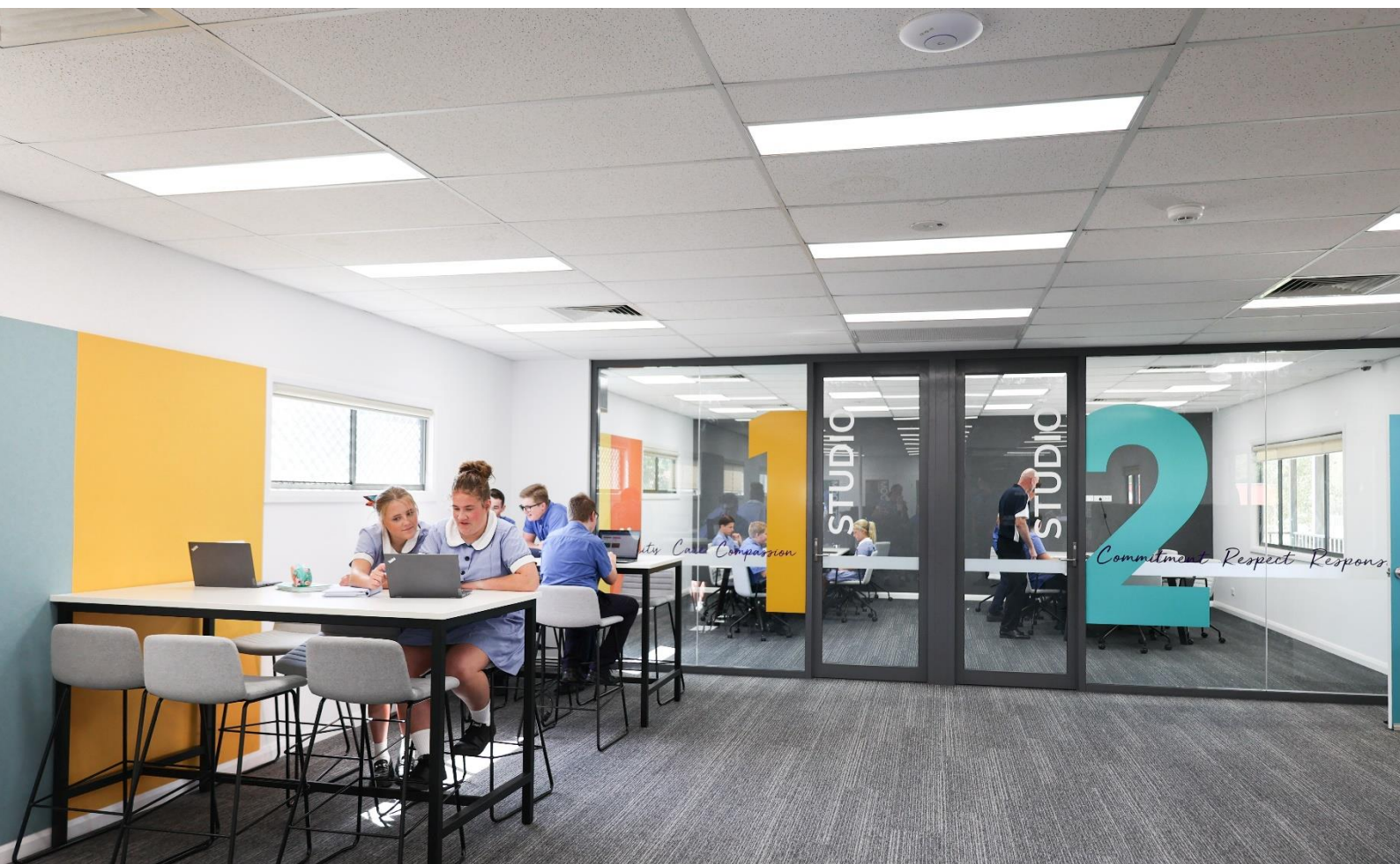

Vocational Education and Training

In 2024 no Year 12 students participated in vocational or trade training. Across all OneSchool Global NSW schools 23% of the Year 12 cohort participated in vocational or trade training. The majority of students in each of the VET Courses sat the HSC examination, Financial Services with Business Services also remaining a popular choice.

Management of Non-Attendance

OneSchool Global NSW - Wagga Wagga Attendance policy meets legislative requirements, with a record of enrolment and daily attendance of all students at the school. Students are expected to attend 100% of their classes.

Attendance reports are sent out on a regular basis to Principals to review any attendance related issues. Regular meetings are held with the school welfare committee to monitor progress and manage issues as they arise. Parents are encouraged to ensure extended leave is held during term breaks. If students are absent for an extended period due to illness, work is organised by their teachers, so the student's learning is not disrupted.

OneSchool Global NSW schools implement a targeted strategy to support strong attendance and address concerns. Proactive measures include early data monitoring, consistent communication, flexible learning options, supportive services, and recognition programs. When issues arise, Principals provide initial support and escalate unresolved cases to Regional leadership. Formal interventions may involve external referrals, with all communications documented. Persistent concerns are addressed through further escalation, including mandatory reporting where necessary.

Stakeholder Satisfaction

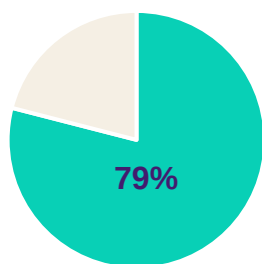
As we continue to ensure our school is the best it can be, regular feedback and input from our students, parents and teachers is important hence surveys were conducted in May 2024.

The 2024 survey focussed on:

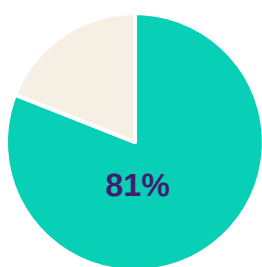
- Engagement

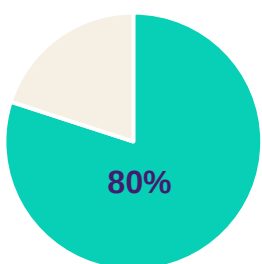
Student Overall Satisfaction



Parent Overall Satisfaction

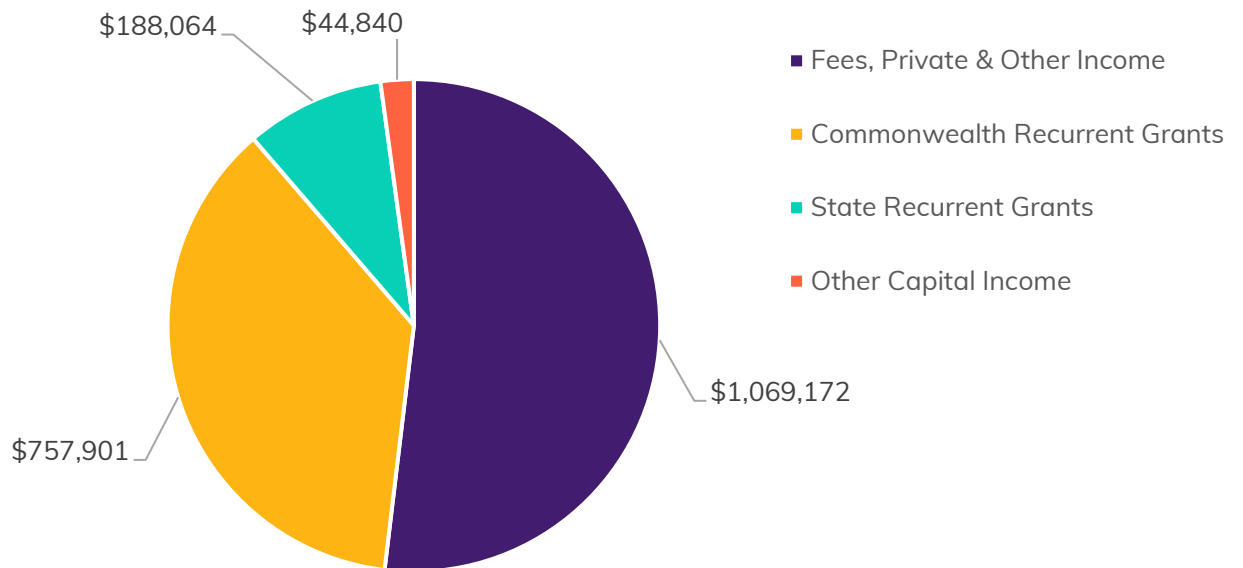


Teacher Overall Satisfaction
